Applying Graduate Students

Candidates who possess a baccalaureate degree in Architecture, Interior Design, Interior Architecture, or Landscape Architecture are eligible for the Master of Interior Architecture 2-Year Track.

Successful candidates will have earned a minimum overall GPA of 3.0 in their undergraduate degree. The GRE exam is not required. Candidates must also pass the portfolio review conducted by the Interior Architecture Department's admissions committee.

PORTFOLIO

Candidates with design backgrounds should submit portfolio of design work that demonstrates the candidate's creative abilities as well as their verbal and graphic communications skills.

A portfolio MUST contain:

- A one-page (maximum) statement describing the candidate's intentions, aspirations, and purpose in pursuing a professional degree in interior design.
- A copy of the candidate's most current transcript.
- A selection of design projects produced within the last three years.

A portfolio MAY contain-

- Examples of recent art projects completed by the candidate.
- Studies of buildings that demonstrate the candidate's analytical ability
- Note: We do not expect or want to see construction documents in these portfolios.
