4. New opportunities for collaboration

The department has established the following opportunities for collaboration

IPAL Internship Program

In the fall of 2017 the FIU Department of Architecture became the 27th program to establish an Integrated Path to Architectural Licensure (IPAL) program. This initiative provides students the opportunity to complete requirements for licensure while earning their degree. Spearheaded by the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards (NCARB), the initiative enables accredited programs to incorporate professional experience and examination into curricula. To learn more about IPAL visit www.ncarb.org/IPAL. The IPAL Program is available as an option in our Master of Architecture 6-year Track. Students in our 5-6 year M.arch Tracks can apply to this program during their third year. Admission into this program is limited and highly selective. Applications will be assessed based on academic excellence, portfolios and firm interviews. Each IPAL internship is a three-year commitment. The following firms participate in this programs: Berenblum Busch Architecture, Bermello Ajamil & Partners, CallisonRTKL, Gurri Matute, HKS, MC Harry Associates. The program currently has 11 interns.

NSF Grant

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In Fall of 2019, led by Professor Shahin Vassigh, a group of faculty and researchers from School of Architecture, School of Computing and Information Science, Construction, STEM Institute Transformation Institute, and Metropolitan Center was awarded a \$1M by the National Science Convergence Accelerator Pilot program. The project, *Preparing the Future Workforce of Architecture, Engineering, and Construction for Automation and Robotic Processes*, will be conducted in two phases. In phase one of the project, the team will plan and develop a prototype virtual reality robotics training software for Architecture, Engineering and Construction (AEC) workers, students, professionals, and businesses, as well as a developing a new model to measure the economic impacts of automation adoption by these industries.

In phase two of the project the team will deliver the *Robotics and Digital Fabrication Academy*, which is a cloud-based automation and robotics training program comprised of an immersive training software, a collaborative knowledge base, an automation forum, and a full economic impact analysis. The research and development for creating the *Robotics and Digital Fabrication Academy* will contribute to application of Artificial Intelligence (AI) and immersive virtual environments in education as well as new ways of examining economic impacts of automation technology adoption in the Architecture, Engineering, and Construction industries.

Crunch Grant

The Climate Resilient Urban Nexus Choices: Operationalizing the Food-Water-Energy Nexus (CRUNCH) grant was awarded by European Union, Horizon 2020, Belmont Forum Collaborative Research January 25, 2018. This grant runs from April 1, 2018 to May 1, 2020 and is led by Principal Investigator, Associate Professor, Thomas Spiegelhalter. The total budget for this grant is \$1,900,000 with \$499,000 for FIU.

CRUNCH is a multi-disciplinary project with an international consortium of project partners and cities addressing all three sectors of food, water and energy through the integrative FWE-Nexus approach. It aims to support local decision and policy makers, practitioners and civil society organizations by translating the key findings of a deep review of literature, knowledge and research evidence on the FWE-Nexus into the design of Urban Living Labs (ULL). The Miami proposal aims to create a carbon-neutral, data driven planning and scenario tool for integrated decision making using the Urban Living Lab (ULL) approach; identifying a data and mapping baseline for the city's needs, developing the tool and framework, testing and analyzing the models using different carbon-neutral and resilient scenarios.

Expanded Study Abroad Programs

In 2018-2019, the Department of Architecture had its greatest student participation in study abroad programs.

In the Fall of 2018, 10 students participated in our semester long Genoa, Italy program and in the Spring of 2019 16 participated. Students in this program collaborate with architecture students and faculty from the University of Genoa (UniGe). This collaboration includes, joint workshops, lectures and classes. In addition, the two programs participate in an Erasmus exchange of faculty and students. The European Union Erasmus Plus Program awarded ka 107 funding for the exchange of FIU and UniGe architecture & design students and faculty for 2016-2018. This exchange provided 2 faculty and 4 students with funding for travel and housing.

In the Summer of 2019, 60 students participated in our Japan Program. The Japan Architecture Abroad program has steadily grown in both success and popularity since its inception in 2013. Beginning with a single section of 18 graduate students and one faculty member, Founding Japan Program Director and Associate Professor Alfredo Andia, PhD, has nurtured and grown the international study program threefold. The 2018, edition of Japan Architecture Abroad included 54 students and 7 faculty members across three study sections. More than 160 FIU students have taken advantage of the Japan program since its commencement. This summer marks the 5th consecutive iteration of the 12-credit graduate program. In 2017-2019 Japan Architecture Abroad program, FIU-CARTA Professor Jaime Canavés, FAIA, working jointly with Japanese-American architect and program advisor Donald T. Yoshino, FAIA and Japanese architect and professor George Kunihiro, FAIA, FJIA, held a series of design workshop

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with Kokushikan University [KU], a private academic institution in Tokyo. The program held discussions with the leadership of the American Institute of Architects Japan Chapter, including President Daishi Yoshimoto, AIA; Past President Scott Gold, FAIA; and architect Michael Van Ackere, AIA, of Maki and Associates. The program also held discussions with the Shimizu Corporation Architect and General Manager Hiroshi Terada, officer of the Japan Institute of Architects [JIA]; and Shimizu International Business Development Manager Suzuki Masanobu. Students and faculty also visited the The United States Embassy in Tokyo.

In the Summer of 2019, 22 students participated in our Bauhaus program. Students visited Weimar, Dessau, and Berlin to learn about the political, social, industrial, architectural, and artistic milieu that gave rise to the Bauhaus and the lasting impact that the Bauhaus has had on culture at large. Students participated in a Bauhaus workshop at original Gropius designed Bauhaus. This program supports the *FIU-CARTA | Bauhaus Dessau Think Tank in Miami*. Dr. Claudia Perren, the Director and CEO of the Bauhaus-Dessau Foundation, and CARTA Dean Brian Schriener signed an exclusive academic partnership in 2015 to create the *FIU-CARTA | Bauhaus Dessau Think Tank in Miami*. FIU is the only university in the United States to have a formal academic partnership with the Bauhaus-Dessau Foundation. With a direct reference to FIU as a solution-center and the Bauhaus-Dessau's establishment for testing radical new ways of "gestalten" our environment, the mission of the *FIU-CARTA | Bauhaus Dessau Think Tank in Miami* will be on creating innovative design solutions for the future – i.e. testing avant-garde ideas, generating answers to new conditions, and establishing new networks.

FIU By Design is a service unit led by Director Mark Marie within the Department of Architecture at Florida International University. Its mission is to enhance our faculty and students' success by serving as an innovative solution center that provides consulting services. Through real-world experiential-learning opportunities, our faculty and expert professionals align our pedagogy with project deliverables for a wide range of clients and organizations. FIU By Design provides opportunities for exceptional students to work shoulder-to-shoulder with our faculty, partners, and clients to gain meaningful learning experiences while contributing to our community's development.

The following FIU By Design projects have either occurred since accreditation:

Liberty Square Rising: \$15,000.00, 2016

The Design Charrette will investigate the potential for an upgrade to one (1) of the existing Red Bull RV trailers. The project will be broken up into three (3) phases.

Mayor's Institute on City Design (MICD): \$50,000.00, 2016

Mayor's Institute on City Design [MICD] is a leadership initiative of the National Endowment for the Arts in partnership with the American Architectural Foundation and the United States Conference of Mayors. In 2016, through a competitive national application process, FIU College of Communication, Architecture + The Arts was selected to co-host the session with the City of Miami Beach.

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Parkland Library Renovation / Addition Envisioning Project: \$15,000.00, 2016

In a collaborative project with the City of Parkland, FIU By Design investigated the renovation of the existing library. The design objectives included the incorporation of natural light and vegetation, merging interior and exterior spaces and providing secure outdoor spaces for reading and recreation. Faculty members and students from the Department of Architecture and Interior Architecture worked on transforming the library's programmatic requirements into multiple design strategies.

Virginia Key Beach Envisioning Project, 2016

A multidisciplinary team of students and faculty from FIU's Department of Architecture, College of Engineering and Sea Level Rise Solution Center collaborated on a Sponsored Design Studio to conduct research for the development of the Historic Virginia Key Beach Park Master Plan. \

Little Havana Community Engagement \$50,000.00, 2017

Florida International University was contracted to help coordinate and host a series of community and stakeholder meetings, through which community members, local law enforcement, the public housing development Resident Council Governing Boards and associated public housing residents, and key stakeholders from the City of Miami and Miami-Dade County will discuss aspects of the redevelopment for the 'Senior Campus' Community.

Little Havana – P2 Charrette with Miami-Dade PHCD + Related Urban Group: \$60,000.00, 2017

Florida International University was asked to produce graphic representations based on a series of six (6) community and stakeholder meetings and Pen-to-Paper Charrette, which included community members, local law enforcement, the public housing development Resident Council Governing Boards and associated public housing residents, and key stakeholders from the City of Miami and Miami-Dade County. The Sponsored Studio will focus on the participant's consensus and recommendations.

Mana Wynwood Envisioning Project: \$15,000.00, 2017

Two architecture graduate studios with 30 students working in teams selected a site in one of the blocks to design a building and develop the Wynwood neighborhood, which will eventually be the site of residential housing, offices, retail shops, hotels, art centers, and convention space that will attract creative types such as artists, entrepreneurs and the technology sector. Projects began with the research of Miami 21 zoning codes and the required regulations for the selected area. Throughout their work, students met with stakeholders to gather information and implement feedback into their projects.

Sweetwater Sponsored Studio: \$20,000.00, 2017

The Sponsored Studio will investigate the potential for an urban analysis and subsequent re-branding of Sweetwater and will help create a framework for the proposed Master Plan.

Viscaya 3d printing: \$12,000.00

FIU will print 3D scaled replicas of sections of the Barge and its sculptures as well as sections of the Pool ceiling mural to establish a handling collection for general visitors, student groups and other educational programs.

7th Avenue CRA: \$10,000.00, 2018

The N.W. 7th Avenue CRA sponsored a Design Charrette in order to envision new 'design guidelines' for the N.W. 7th Avenue CRA. This design included landscape plans and urban studies for the selected area.

Alamo Park: \$9,000.00, 2018

This Design Charrette performed an envisioning study and design(s) for an exterior shaded band shell which will be used as a music venue on a year-round basis. This design included design plans for the selected site and will then later focus on a specific details regarding program and use. FIU By Design and the Departments of Architecture and Landscape Architecture created conceptual plans and drawings.

City of North Miami Chinatown Design Guidelines: \$30,250.00

Florida International University has been asked to assist in the creation of a set of design guidelines and graphic representations, while coordinating with the City of North Miami and key stakeholders from public and private sector(s). The Charrette will focus on the city of North Miami's consensus and recommendations. FIU faculty and students will implement all recommendations into the design process and coordinate with all stakeholders on key decisions regarding the project.

Grace Arts Center: Mobile Arts Pavilion (MAP) Sponsored Studio: \$10,000.00

The department has not had any significant changes in educational approaches other than those to address the “not mets” from the last accreditation visit (see response to these items). Department does continue to make adjustments to improve student learning and experiences. As noted above we have grown student participation in Study Abroad and created an IPAL internship program.

Growth in our Career Fair paralleled a need to improve our student’s preparedness for the profession. This resulted in the reinforcement of portfolio development throughout the curriculum with two focus points: one the midway through the program during Design 6 and at the terminal semester as part of the Professional Office Practice Class.

Our two major grants: The Climate Resilient Urban Nexus Choices: Operationalizing the Food-Water-Energy Nexus (CRUNCH) and the NSF Preparing the Future Workforce of Architecture, Engineering, and Construction for Automation and Robotic Processes grant provide select students with the opportunities to work on cutting edge research.

With the investments in robotics, the department has worked to incorporate this new technology into the making culture of the school. This has involved a series of student workshops on how to use the robots, a series of elective seminars and new micro-credentialing courses in computation design.

The department has had the following significant changes in physical resources:

The Robotics and Fabrication Lab

The Robotics and Fabrication Lab (RDF) was inaugurated in Fall 2018. This new facility is located within the FIU School of Architecture Building and required the modification of a classroom and renovation of a storage area into a robotic lab. The development of this interdisciplinary facility was led by Director of Technology Development Shahin Vassigh and was a collaboration with the College of Communication, Architecture + the Arts and the College of Engineering and Computing. The RDF Laboratory is the first of its kind in the state of Florida featuring two industrial robotic arms, 3D scanners, laser cutters, programmable objects, and 3D printers. The lab offers unique technology solutions for design, testing, prototyping, and fabrication. RDF is an extension of FIU’s Integrated Computer Augmented Virtual Environment (I-CAVE), which is a fully immersive and interactive facility. These facilities are designed to support diverse and innovative ways of using high end visualization equipment for digital fabrication as well as advancing fabrication technologies and tools through visualization.
