



MASTER OF INTERIOR ARCHITECTURE DEGREE

The 5-year Master of Interior Architecture (MIA) program provides a seamless course of study leading from undergraduate freshman year to the conferral of the Professional Master of Interior Architecture degree. The Accelerated MIA degree program, it has several entry points for applicants with different backgrounds. The MIA degree program accepts applicants who have just graduated from high school, along with people who have baccalaureate degrees in other fields, baccalaureate degrees in architecture or landscape architecture, or associate of arts degrees in architecture, landscape architecture or interior design.

The following data was collected using institutional records, alumni surveys, and State of Florida employment data.

Student Attrition and Retention

Students admitted into the third year fall of 2014 returned in fourth year fall of 2015, putting attrition at 24%.

86%

Students enrolled in the third year fall of 2014 returned in fourth year fall of 2015, putting attrition at 14%.

Number of Master of Interior Architecture Degrees Awarded in 2015. Of the students graduating in 2015, 43% were accelerated track and all graduated in 5 years, 25% were enrolled in the 3 year track and all graduated in 3 years, 31% were enrolled in the 2yr track all graduated in 2 years.

Students who graduated in 2015 are employed in interior design or a related profession. 7% of graduates were not looking for work.
