SPANISH LANGUAGE JOURNALISM

With two specializations (Spanish-language Journalism + Multimedia and Spanish-language Journalism in Latin American + Caribbean Studies) this unique master's program, founded in 1994 and taught entirely in Spanish, is designed for aspiring and experienced journalists who want to work at the professional level in Spanish-language media in the U.S., Latin America, or Europe. The focus of the program is on the development of the writing, critical thinking, analytical, investigative, ethical, and technological skills necessary for a professional career in journalism.
